

The filet crochet chart consists of empty and filled squares. Empty squares correspond to open mesh spaces, while filled squares represent the design


## pattern

## You will need:

- Lily yarn (100% mercerized cotton, 125 m/50 g) 20 g in pink,
- crochet hook No. 1.9.







Chain the required number of foundation chains based on 3 chains per mesh square + 1 chain for the edge stitch + 3 turning chains in place of the first double crochet of Row 1.

Make the first double crochet into the 9th chain from the hook, then continue as follows: chain 2, 1 double crochet, skipping 2 chains of the base, repeat – to the end of the row.





For a filled square, crochet 3 double crochets.








To decrease an empty square at the beginning of a row, chain 2 for turning + 1 chain, then make a double crochet for the second square. This forms a triangle in place of the first square.





To decrease an empty square at the end of a row, make 1 half double treble crochet (htr) instead of the last square (do not chain 2 in this case).







To decrease a filled square at the end of a row, crochet 3 incomplete double crochets and 1 half double treble crochet, then finish all loops together.



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
